

SE-WY-CO FIRE COMPANY PARTICIPATES IN OPERATION SAFE A LIFE

Free smoke alarms are being made available through a program coordinated by the Pennsylvania Fire Commissioner and WFMZ-TV, 69 News. The long-life lithium battery detectors are part of a grant program intended to help low income residents, the elderly, and families with children.

WFMZ-TV has dubbed the program, Operation Save a Life. The terms of the grant require local fire departments to physically install the detectors in residents' homes, and the (fill in the blank) Fire Company has volunteered to do the work.
